Selfishness is one of the characteristics of children of God who are spiritually immature. I DECLARE: Ezekiel 36:26 - I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; I will take the heart of stone out of your flesh and give you a heart of flesh.

I READ: Romans 12: 12 - 17

Genesis 37 records the life story of Joseph and his brothers. Joseph's brothers envied and hated him for no reason. They put him into the well and then sold him to the Egyptians. Through it all, He chose not to be angry. He also chose not to seek revenge or felt bitter with what he had to experience in his life.
