

SATURDAY HAVE THE DESIRE FOR THE LORD AND HIS WORD**I READ:** Psalms 42:1-5, Psalms 1:1-3

A heart that has repented is a heart that longs for God and His word. In Psalms 42, David said that our desire for the Lord should resemble a deer that thirst after water and will endlessly look for a river so that it can satisfy its thirst. Is our desire comparable to that of the deer that David mentioned in his Psalms, the desire that will chase after God through prayer and worship until our time to meet Him and be in His presence? Is our desire still a burning desire as if it was the first time we read the word of God? Is the word of God stills our source of joy, or is it something that has become mundane? Let our passion for the Lord still burn as if it was the first time we encountered Him.

I DECLARE: *Psalms 119:81 - My soul faints for Your salvation, but I hope in Your word.*

I DO: What action will I take today after meditating on the Word of God?

ANNUAL BIBLE READING: EXODUS 10-12

SUNDAY BELIEVE AND OBEY**I READ:** John 2:1-11, Ezekiel 36:26

The first miracle that was performed by Jesus when He was on earth was turn water into wine during a wedding in Cana. When they ran out of wine, a miracle happened because Jesus' mother believed in His power. Also because the servants were obedient. The servants were told to do whatever Jesus asked them to do. They obeyed Mary and when Jesus asked them to fill the waterpots with water, they did exactly that. They then were asked to draw some water and take it to the master of the feast. Even though what was asked of them didn't make sense, they obeyed. They could have been fired by the master of the feast if the water did not change into wine, but nevertheless, they were obedient in doing everything Jesus asked them to do.

MONDAY GIVE THANKS**I READ:** John 6:1-15

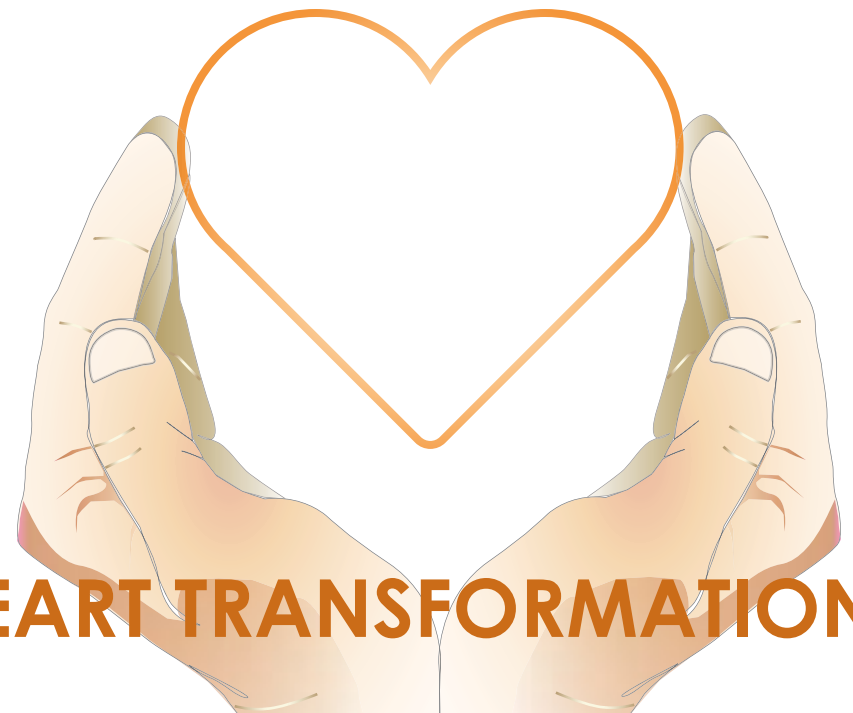
Acquiring a grateful heart is an earmark of having a heart transformation. When Jesus walked on earth he performed the miracle of feeding the 5,000 people not including their wives and children. Provided with five loaves and two fish, they all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over. This miracle happened right after Jesus took the loaves of bread and fish and gave thanks to the Father in Heaven. There is great power in giving thanks. Thanksgiving precedes great miracles. In a different manner, for 40 years the Israelites wandered in the wilderness and spent most of their life with complains and thanklessness. At the end of the story, their generation wasn't allowed to enter and enjoy the blessings of their promised land.

HEART TRANSFORMATION

TUESDAY COMPASSION**I READ:** Acts 10:9-29

One of the attribute of having a heart transformation is showing compassion to others. We are transformed to be less critical and judgmental. Additionally, we are reshaped to be more benevolent toward others. In the story of Peter's culinary vision, God advised him to go and spread the gospel to the gentiles (according to the Jewish law, Jews were prohibited to be associated with gentiles). Peter obeyed God and he showed compassion to the gentiles who had the desire to come to God. God loves all nations, not only the Jews. He has the desire to save all. As a result of Peter's obedience, a miracle happened. That day, Cornelius and his household received God's salvation and they were all baptized by the Holy Spirit (Acts 10:44-48).

I DECLARE: *Romans 10:12 - For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, for the same Lord over all is rich to all who call upon Him.*

I DO: What action will I take today after meditating on the Word of God?

ANNUAL BIBLE READING: GENESIS 48-50

WEDNESDAY BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST**I READ:** Psalms 133, Psalms 26

Heart repentance is a change of heart which pursues peace and unity especially among believers. It is a community where everyone is in unity, supporting and strengthening each other. Psalms 26 states the importance of surrounding ourselves among children of God. When our lives are led by the wrong community, it will cause a decline in our spiritual life. We are not limited to whom we are friends with, however we have to guard our mind and heart when we are interacting with people who have not known our Lord Jesus. Let not our relationship with our friends hinder our walk and journey with the Lord. As children of God we shall prioritize the relationship between us and the Lord before others.

I DECLARE: *1 Corinthians 15:33 - Do not be deceived: "Evil company corrupts good habits."*

ANNUAL BIBLE READING: EXODUS 1-3

THURSDAY DON'T BE DOUBLE-MINDED**I READ:** 1 Kings 18:20-40

Today we are going to learn about a dedicated heart in our relationship with our Lord Jesus. Elijah is a good example of someone who experienced the power and miracle of God when a fire came down from heaven and burnt the altar in front of the children of Israel. This miracle happened due to his complete dedication to the Lord. Whereas the children of Israel during that time were not faithful and dedicated to the Lord as they were serving their flesh and god of Baal. The word of God reminds us multiple times to only dedicate our hearts only to Him. We have to repent if we are still prioritizing anything else other than our Lord, whether it is family, our job, or ourselves.

I DECLARE: *James 4:8 - Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded.*

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I PRAY: Pray as guided by the Holy Spirit

ANNUAL BIBLE READING: EXODUS 4-6

FRIDAY SURRENDER FULLY**I READ:** Psalms 37:1-6

Repentance of our hearts is also synonymous with surrendering our life fully to God. Ask ourselves whether we still hold on to some parts of our lives or have we surrendered completely to God. When we surrender fully to the Lord, He will also faithfully act fully on our behalf. If we are only willing to give partially to the Lord, He will also act partially for us. As a result, we will have to depend on our own effort for the other part where we don't fully submit to the Lord. Jesus has borne everything for us on the cross, because of that we do not need to rely solely on our own efforts. Surrender yourself completely to God and in return, He will bless us abundantly.

I DECLARE: *Proverbs 16:3 - Commit your works to the Lord, and your thoughts will be established.*
