I READ: Deuteronomy 28:7; 1 Corinthians 15:57-58; Romans 8:37

TUESDAY NEW STRENGTH

I READ: Isaiah 40: 29-31; 57:10

I READ: Ezekiel 36:26-27; Proverbs 27:19
