SATURDAY PRAYER WALK

I READ: Genesis 41: 45-49; Joshua 1:3

Joseph had performed a prayer walk when he had just been appointed as viceroy of Egypt by Pharaoh. Joseph was given the task of regulating the Egyptian kingdom and anticipating the incoming famine. The first thing he did was to do a prayer walk around the land of Egypt. He had gone over all the land of Egypt and had a spiritual warfare to rebuke all evil spirits that would bring hunger and poverty to Egypt and also he blessed all the land of Egypt. As a result, the land of Egypt experienced an extraordinary abundance of crop, so that when famine struck, they had enough food. Wheat also symbolizes souls. We learn today that when we do the prayer walk, whether it be in our workplace, at school, or in other places, there will be a harvest of souls.

I DECLARE: *Joshua 1: 3- Every place that the sole of your foot will tread upon I have given to you, as I said to Moses.*

I DO: What action will I take today after meditating on the Word of God?

I PRAY: Pray as guided by the Holy Spirit.

ANNUAL BIBLE READING: PSALM 148-150

SUNDAY PRAYER TOWER

I READ: 2 Chronicles 7: 11-16

The harvest of souls is always linked to the prayer tower. Today we will be learned from Solomon's story when he finished building the temple in Jerusalem. After he ordained the temple, the Lord then spoke to him. For the Israelites to continue be blessed and restored by God, they had to pray a lot and repent from their sins. Today God gives us the same message. We need to stand in the gap and pray a lot for the souls, so God will forgive and begin to restore them. At the prayer tower, we need to pray often for souls, for our workplace, for our schools, for our city, and for nations. Harvest of souls will start to happen if we continue to pray.

I DECLARE: 2 Chronicles 7:15 - Now My eyes will be open and My ears attentive to prayer made in this place

I READ: Matthew 14:14 – 16, Luke 1:78



PRAYER EVANGELISM

TUESDAY SOULS AROUND US

I READ: John 4:5-42

The first evangelism written in the Bible was about a Samaritan woman who met Jesus at the city of Sychar. When she encountered Jesus, she believed and received Him as her Lord. She then returned to her city and testified to the other Samaritans about Jesus. That led to her relatives and friends to believe in Jesus. This story tells us how evangelism is our mission field for others around us. They can be our coworkers, school mates, family members, and others. Acts 1:8 says that we are going to be a witness in Jerusalem, which also speaks about our family. It also refers to Judea, which speaks about our friends. Samaria speaks about our distant relatives or friends. Even to the end of the earth speaks about others we do not know like “homeless” people and probably those we see in the metro stations.

I DECLARE: *John 1:8 - But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.*

I DO: What actions am I going to take after meditating on the Word of God?

ANNUAL BIBLE READING: PSALM 138-139

WEDNESDAY TO INTERCEDE

I READ: Genesis 18:20-33

When Abraham found out that Sodom and Gomorrah was going to be punished because of all of the sins committed and because the people did not know the Lord, he started to intercede for Sodom. Abraham prayed and stood in the gap between the Lord and that city. He bargained with God so that the city could be saved from punishment. Without ceasing, he prayed continuously. Even though in the end the city was punished because God could not find the amount of righteous people Abraham had bargained for, Lot’s family (Abraham’s nephew) was saved because of Abraham’s prayers. The Lord ordered his angel to save Lot’s family and to bring them out of the city. When we intercede for souls, God will answer and save them.

I DECLARE: *1 Thessalonians 5:17 - Pray without ceasing*

I DO: What actions am I going to take after meditating on the Word of God?

I PRAY: Pray as guided by the Holy Spirit

ANNUAL BIBLE READING: PSALM 140-141

THURSDAY PRAYER AND FASTING

I READ: Isaiah 58:6-7, Matthew 17:14-21

Often times when we pray for someone, it feels like it’s a big burden. The person that we are praying for may be hard headed and not easy to evangelize to. We need a spiritual breakthrough in order to get through to them. That is when we need to do more than just interceding for them. We need to pray breakthrough prayers that are full of God’s power in order to get through these souls. We need to accompany our prayers with fasting. Jesus gave the same advice to His disciples when they they were having a difficult time praying for the child who was possessed by the devil and who had epilepsy. He advised them to pray and fast so that the boy could experience a breakthrough.

I DECLARE: *Isaiah 58:6 - Is this not the fast that I have chosen: To loose the bonds of wickedness, to undo the heavy burdens, to let the oppressed go free, and that you break every yoke?*

I DO: What actions am I going to take after meditating on the Word of God?

I PRAY: Pray as guided by the Holy Spirit

ANNUAL BIBLE READING: PSALM 142-144

FRIDAY TEAM WORK

I READ: Luke 10:1, Ecclesiastes 4:9-12

One of our calls in life is to preach the gospel. In fulfilling this call, we need other people to work together with us. Even Jesus when He lived in the world, in fulfilling the Father’s call in His life, He needed His disciples to work with Him. He sent the disciples two by two (team) to oversee each city He was going to visit. When we work as a team, God will be with us with signs and wonders. The Book of Ecclesiastes also says that if we work in teams, we will strengthen each other. More than that, we also cannot be defeated by the devil, because in the midst of our being together, God is present.

I DECLARE: *Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 - Two are better than one, Because they have a good reward for their labor. For if they fall, one will lift up his companion. But woe to him who is alone when he falls, For he has no one to help him up.*

I DO : What action will Intake today after meditating on the Word of God?
