I READ: Job 1:1-5 & 1: 22.

Job was blameless and upright, and one who feared God and shunned evil. He would burnt daily offerings to appease God for all his children wrongdoings. When Satan took all his possessions, family and health, Job continued to be blameless and upright. He did not sin nor charged God with wrong (Job 1:22). Throughout his life, Job honored God, Job understood that his God is a great God, the creator of heaven and earth with His absolute Sovereignty. TO OBEY

I READ: Matthew 26:36-46.

Amid His distress, He prayed to the Father in Heaven: "O My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will." Many children of God claim that it is difficult to live an obedient life to the Lord and His Word because as humans, we still have the lust of the flesh. To be obedient is a choice. HAVE FAITH

IREAD: Genesis 15:1-6.

will not receive anything. Therefore, continue to have faith and don't be shaken; then, we can experience miracles.

I DO: I will memorize verses that will strengthen my faith to prepare myself when things are not what I expect them to be.

I PRAY: I will pray so that wherever God places me, I will be bold and stay strong in Christ.

DECLARE THE WORD

I READ: Genesis 1

GIVING TITHES

I READ: Malachi 3:6-11

Malachi 3:8 says that the Israelites robbed God in tithes. They might have given their tithes or only gave a part of their tithes. This verse implicitly shows that tithes belong to the Lord and have to be returned to Him. God requires His children to give tithes not because He needs the money, but it is a test of whether we are willing to be obedient and not be greedy. In other words, He wants our hearts to not be bounded to money. Often times, a person does want to give their tithes using the following excuses: they do do not have enough, the church is already rich, they do not trust that tithes will be used by the church correctly, or they think that giving tithes is not a must. These excuses can hinder God's blessings to come into their lives. For those who are faithful in giving their tithes, God promises to bless them abundantly and rebuke the devourers from their lives. The fence of protection and God's grace will also protect their lives and possession. They will experience many of God's miracles in their lives.

I DECLARE: 2 Corinthians 9:7: So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver.

I DO: I want to start to give tithes and special offerings in my local church.

I PRAY: I will pray for more and more children of God to produce many fruits of the Spirit so that they may be an impact for this nation.

TO SOW

I READ: Genesis 26:1-13
